Constitution (Amendment of Existing Law) Order Statutory Instrument 43 of 1994

Commenced on 27 June 1994

1.

This Order may be cited as the Constitution (Amendment of Existing Law) Order.

2.

In this Order "existing law" has the meaning assigned to it in paragraph I of Schedule 7 of the Constitution.

3.

Where an expression specified in column I of the Schedule occurs in any existing law there shall be substituted, for that expression, the expression specified in the corresponding entry in column 2 of that Schedule.
